## NOTES AND LEGISLATION

### Some Current Factors in Wage Disputes— Work of the War Labor Board

The "Little Steel"<sup>1</sup> or "15%" formula is a milestone in the wage stabilization program which the War Labor Board had been delimiting and developing for some five months prior to the Executive Order of October 3, 1942.<sup>2</sup> No doubt it took its initial impetus from the
